Foreword

This international proceeding is a compilation of papers written by the speakers of both speakers in the plenary session and parallel sessions. This international seminar is annually held by STAIN (State College for Islamic Studies) Kediri, and this year event is organized by *Tadris Bahasa Inggris* (English education). Furthermore, the topic of the seminar—Character Building in English Language Teaching—was intentionally selected for we—English teachers—would also like to contribute to the character building of the nation, since in the last few years Indonesia has encountered moral decadence particularly among youngsters.

Collins.

In addition, the speakers in the parallel sessions were carefully chosen by a team of reviewers, again, on the basis of their expertise. They are from all over Indonesia, and some of them living in Australia. They are from a variety of disciplines within the English language teaching. They are practitioners in the grassroots. They are high school English teachers and English lecturers all over Indonesia. The last is decision makers, such as *Kadiknas*, school principals and so forth.

Moreover, I would like to express my sincere gratitude to any party, particularly to the organizing committee for the success of the seminar.
